The stone base is rectangular and is surrounded by a stone bench at the bottom. The base is inscribed: George Rogers Clark Conqueror of the Northwest</p> <p>The entire area on the south side of W. Main St. between Jefferson Park Avenue and the railroad bridge is a public park. The monument sits in a grassy clearing facing Main St. while the rest of the area is wooded.</p>

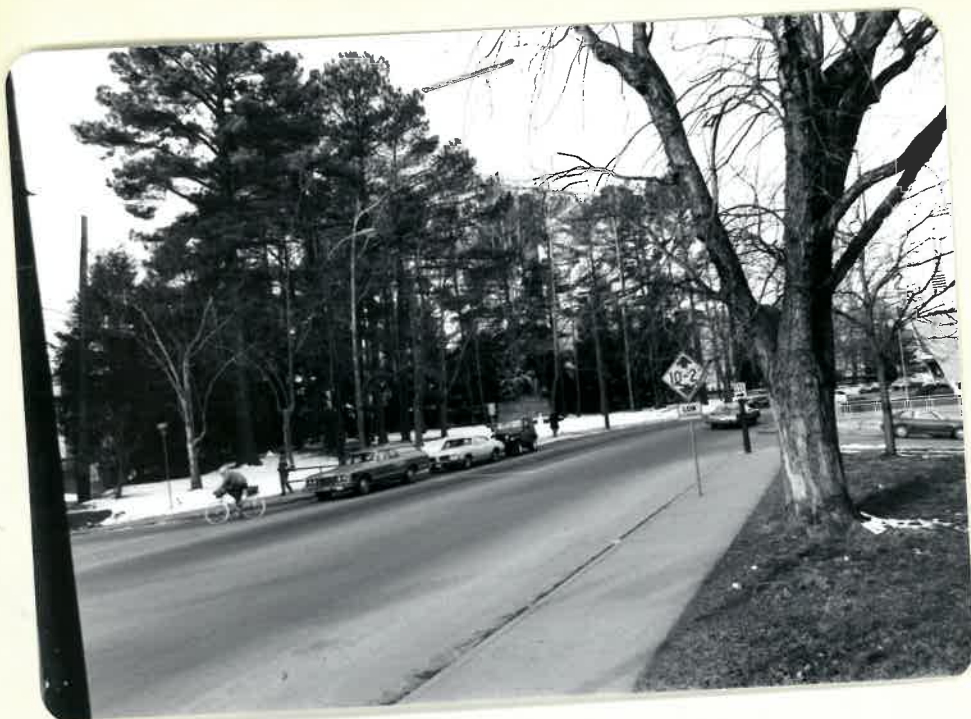
The entire south side of the street is a public park.
