

WINTER HAVEN BUILDING

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This one-story, eight-bay, Vernacular Modern institutional building is of brick, concrete block, and frame construction, with the brick walls laid in running bond. It is in two sections, consisting of a rectangular block fronting Ridge Street, with a raised foundation at the rear, and a perpendicular rear wing that is two stories in height. Both sections have gabled roofs covered with composition shingles. The front section has a brick-veneered front facade, while its northeast wall and the lower levels of the rear and southwest side are of concrete block, and the upper level of the rear and southwest walls is covered with siding. The rear wing is concrete block, with brick veneer on the southwest wall. The front section has six-over-six double-hung wood sash windows, with false muntins, and one-over-one double hung sash in the second level of the rear facade. There are inoperable blinds at the windows of the front section. The rear wing's windows have two large, side-by-side panes without muntins, and the window openings have brick sills. At the front of the building are two wooden ramps with rails composed of three horizontal members, which lead to entrances at each end of the front facade. Between them is a central entrance with a small unroofed porch. There is a parking lot in the "L" formed by the building's shape. The building and its parking area nearly fill the sloping corner lot on which they are located, at the east corner of the intersection of Ridge Street and Garrett Street. Landscaping elements on the site consist of hedges planted at the front of the building, and next to the parking lot.

HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

The northern half of this lot was the site of a two-story vernacular wooden house with Victorian details which was built in 1892 by Eliza E. Norris and always occupied by members of her family (ACDB 3-281; City WB 2-151, 17-179, 19-365). Her daughters, Minnie, Elsie, and Daisy Norris operated a knitting shop downtown. They purchased the adjoining vacant lot in 1933 (City DB 79-321). The house was demolished in 1971, two years before the death of the last sister. The 218 Ridge Corporation acquired the property in 1984 (DB 448-151). It erected this building in 1987, according to tax records, and sold it the following year to Winter Haven Limited Partnership, which has operated an adult care facility there since 1987 (DB 511-708, 583-368). An addition was made to the building in 1990.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Winter Haven Building is a Vernacular Modern institutional building with minimal elaboration. The front section of the building has the low profile and rectangular footprint associated with the Ranch style, carried out in a larger overall size than a domestic building would present. The structure is incompatible in design, scale, and form with the contributing resources in the Historic District, and is also non-contributing because of its recent date of construction.


