MATTHEWS HOUSE

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This 2-story, 2-bay, four-square brick house, laid in seven-course common bond, has a pyramidal hipped roof clad with standing-seam metal. The front, north, and south sides have hip-roofed dormers with boxed cornices, frieze boards, and two-part windows with single panes that are replacements for what were probably one-overone double-hung sash. The house has a boxed cornice above a frieze board, two interior chimneys of brick, and a part-exterior rear brick chimney. At the rear of the house is a one-story, hip-roofed section, one bay deep, with a porch in the southwest corner. The windows, some of which are paired, are one-over-one, double-hung wood sash, with shallow segmentally-arched lintels. Over the entrance is an elliptical fanlight, and the door is flanked by sidelights. There is a one-story, four-bay, Colonial Revival front porch with a hipped roof on Doric columns, with a wood railing containing square wood balusters. The house is sited on an elevated corner lot on the west corner of the intersection of Ridge Street and Oak Street, and there is a stone retaining wall along the front and northeast side of the lot.

HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

J. C. and Mattie G. Matthews purchased the Bibb-Wolfe House at 505 Ridge Street in 1908 (City DB 20-311) and subdivided its large lot. According to tax records, they built this house for their own residence in 1915, and two rental houses behind it on Oak Street in 1912 and 1915. They sold the Bibb-Wolfe House soon after the completion of their new house. J. C. Matthews owned an ice cream parlor on Main Street, and Mattie Gleason Matthews was the daughter of John J. Gleason, who lived at 528 Ridge Street. The house was sold by their heirs in 1946 (WB 3-488, DB 126-242) and divided into three rental units. Robert M. and Buford A. Thomas bought the house in 1958 (DB 210-8), and there have been several transactions within their family (WB 10-283; DB 449-97, 450-178, 458-229, 465-352).

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Matthews House is significant as an example of a four-square with Colonial Revival stylistic elements, and in form, scale, and style it is compatible with the other contributing resources in the Historic District. The house occupies a visually important site on an elevated corner lot, near the northeast end of the District and the commercial properties at that terminus.
