

Miscellaneous descriptive information (plan, exterior and interior decoration, cornice/eave type, window type and trim, chimneys, additions, alterations)

Unique in Charlottesville, this Mediterranean-style apartment complex recalls the 1920s, when exotic architectural styles were toyed with in all parts of the country. This courtyard complex is largely unaltered, and should be preserved.

Presently painted light pink, the stucco cladding is applied roughly, to give visual texture to the walls. The roofline is enlivened by parapet false fronts, and the porch roofs are covered in pantiles.

The Real Estate office and Sanborn maps indicate this apartment group was built in the 1920s.
