A. Minutes

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Architectural Review was called to order by John Farmer, President. The minutes of the last regular meeting were approved with the following corrections:

On line 4, Mr. Booker should be Mrs. Booker.

B. New Applications

BAR 80-114: "Northwood" White residence; addition of wood shed to south side of property on 621 Park Street.

After discussion, it was proposed by Mrs. Smith that we grant a certificate of appropriateness on condition of further planning. A plan for this planting must be sent to the Board for their approval. Mrs. Schatz seconded the motion. The motion passed with Mr. Herndon voting against it for the reason that he felt it unnecessary to submit a landscaping plan.

BAR 80-115: Holy Comforter Catholic Church; new addition and demolition of 208 East Jefferson Street, 210 East Jefferson Street; Jack Rinehart, architect.

The architect, Mr. Jack Rinehart, made a presentation to the Board several months ago. The major change from the previous presentation was not doing the eastern portion as was originally planned. Bishop Sullivan decided to keep the longitudinal plan so the entrance would remain the same. The architect proposed to use the existing materials (i.e. brick, slate, glass, etc.). Mr. Rinehart plans to come back before the Board for landscaping. The adjacent building at 208 East Jefferson Street will have to be demolished, and Mr. Rinehart says that this is of no architectural significance.

Mrs. Smith stated that she wanted to go on record against the demolition of this house on principle. She explained that even though she approves of the church addition she feels this house is important to the block as it compliments the Red Cross house next door. Mr. Oakey expressed the same sentiment.

After further discussion, Mr. Herndon moved that an approval for certificate of appropriateness be granted on the condition that the demolition of 208 East Jefferson Street be a part of the building permit. Mrs. Schatz seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

BAR 80-116: CAARC residential building additions - 515 Park Street - "Watson House". James Tuley, architect.

Mr. Tuley made a presentation for an additional bath on the second floor with a fire escape. He also proposed to fill in the porch areas with white panelling as well as storm windows and other changes on the porch.

The staff preference was to have the stairs go off the back of the house and to keep the balustrades similar to those on the rear porches. Mr. Tuley said that the stairs and handrails will be painted white and the rods black. The addition would be of six inch smooth hand-painted boards on the exterior. The storm windows proposed would be aluminum painted white.

Ashlin Smith moved that we accept the plan as proposed with the condition that the position of the fire escape be further explored.

Mr. Herndon seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

C. Other Items

Ashlin Smith asked that the Board go by and observe the house at the corner of Park and Farrish Sts. on the northeast corner. This house is presently owned by Mr. Mustard. Mrs. Smith asked the Board to determine if it is necessary to exercise the Board's right in Section 31-141.

Mrs. Schatz stated that she would like to see City Council begin a program of placing utility lines underground in the downtown historic areas as a part of their Capital Improvement Program. She moved that the BAR endorse such a program at the joint public hearing on this. Mr. Oakey seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with Mr. Farmer agreeing to speak on the BAR's behalf at the hearing.


