PARKS AND RECREATION ADVISORY BOARD MINUTES July 16, 2014

The Parks and Recreation Advisory Board held a regular meeting on Wednesday, July 16, 2014 @ 5:30 p.m. held @ Carver Recreation Center. Members present were: Byron Brown, Anne Hemenway, David Hirschman, Scott Marshall, Ned Michie, Jordan Phemister and Maurice Walker. Members absent: Ruth Barnett and Llezelle Dugger.

Staff: Brian Daly, Doug Ehman and Vic Garber

Minutes:

Ned Michie made a motion to approve minutes, David Hirschman second, motion was unanimously approved.

McIntire Park Design Status

- ➤ Brian Daly reported that over the last 30 days a lot of progress has been made on the design of east side of the McIntire Park.
- Reported that there had been a coordination conference call with Stantec and Parks and Recreation staff
- Reviewed proposed layout maps
- Agreement details for maintenance have not been worked out, ex. w/Botanical Gardens
- David Hirschman asked how wide trails were for ADA, Doug Ehman replied 8-10 feet
- > Community meeting was held June 10, second meeting scheduled September 4 @ Carver Center
- Guest Lena Saville was interested in making sure there was a dynamic eco system and exposure to plants with deep roots

Skate park Design Status

- ➤ Vic Garber reported that Byron Brown & Anne Hemenway attended the last Skate park meeting
- At the last meeting the two concepts were merged together
- Presented a power point on skate park which included other locations for skate parks that Stantec had designed; green strategies; artistic impression; reviewed design process
- Design now has 5 different components
- > Fine tuning elevations
- Maurice Walker asked about lighting, Vic Garber replied that they were working w/Musco on a lighting system
- Tweaking final designs, geotechnical work to finish it up
- Revenue possibilities classes, tournaments, camps

Rives Park

- > Doug Ehman reported that the project was back on track, restroom set, it is a modular unit
- Asphalting done, last piece, concrete flat work
- > Trail section funding has been found for trail work
- Project should hopefully be done by end of August

Azalea Park Master Plan Implementation Update

> Doug Ehman reported that the project was at the same place as last month.

- Picnic shelter, restroom building in production, restroom & picnic shelter should be done by Labor Day
- > Stated that there were problems with siting, flood plain
- Committed to community to be completed by middle of September
- > Trail work, covers on dugouts need to be done

Garden Plot Allocation Process Public Discussion Update

- Doug Ehman reported that last month a third meeting was held on July 8. Discussion on allocation and management
- General satisfaction with allocation process
- Provide the first opportunity for new or newly vacant plots to residents within close proximity of the park, staff recommends ¼ mile
- Appreciate the management approach staff has taken
- Possibly establish organic only growing areas
- Establishment of water sources possible pitcher pumps
- Expansion of garden plots in other parks
- > Form final recommendations to the community at a final meeting in September
- ➤ Rives Park Master Plan amendment to City Council likely 2nd meeting in September
- > Ned Michie suggested the county plot owners not be allowed to renew until after city residents have an opportunity

David Hirschman made a motion to adopt garden plot allocation process, Anne Hemenway second, motion was unanimously approved.
