PARKS AND RECREATION ADVISORY BOARD MINUTES May 20, 2015

The Parks and Recreation Advisory Board held a regular meeting on Wednesday, May 20, 2015 at 5:30 p.m. held @ Carver Recreation Center. Members present were: Ruth Barnett, Byron Brown, Llezelle Dugger, Anne Hemenway, Ned Michie, Scott Morgan and Mary Wilson. Members absent: David Hirschman, Jody Lahendro and Maurice Walker.

Minutes

Ned Michie made a motion to approve April 15th minutes, Scott Morgan second, motion was unanimously approved.

Youth Programs Summer Preview

- Erica Goode, Recreation Supervisor responsible for youth/adult classes, youth camps and special activities reported the following:
 - Registered classes dance, gymnastics, beekeeping, etc. 720 classes, 5,040 participants
 - 30 instructors, 194% cost recovery, average 7 people in a class, most popular art & tumbling
 - Always looking for new class ideas, drop in programming youth development
 - Art Adventures program has recently won an award from the Virginia Recreation & Park Society. This program is designed to encourage students to learn through play and sensory experience as they create small & large works, exercising fine and gross motor skills.
 - Drop in exercise classes 42 classes/week, 2,100 classes/year, 20 instructors, yoga, kettle bells, anyone with access pass can participate, 5,375 participants this year so far,
 - Summer Camps Pre-k 10th grade @ Clark, Jackson Via and Greenbrier schools, preteen @ Carver Center & Walker School; Teen @ Key Center. Program is operated in partnership w/Class program, youth can ride city buses, provide breakfast & lunch, partner with profit & nonprofit for experiences
 - Camp activities include swimming, filmmaking, robotics, fencing, drumming, outdoor adventure, tap in to resources in Parks & Recreation; field trips – ex. Science Museum,
 - Winter & spring break camps
 - Afterschool programs Friendship Court, Westhaven Center
 - Just received \$25,000 grant for afterschool program from NRPA/Wal-Mart nutrition standards for better health
 - Special events Kid Float June 6; Fitness Challenge partner w/city schools, Friday
 Night Live throughout school year
 - Byron Brown stated that the participation numbers shows the quality of programs

McIntire Park Design Status Report

- ➤ Brian Daly stated that the design for City Council approved; Phase I of project in process
 - McIntire Golf course will close May 31

Skatepark Design Status Report

- ➤ Vic Garber reported that the final design for the Skatepark has been approved by City Council
- Met with Stantec, reviewing plans for erosion, grading, etc. for each feature
- > Stantec, Line & Grade their work should be completed by September
- Fundraising strategy hope to have a plan by end of September, individual donors, partnerships, major foundations, sponsorship plan, naming rights. Goal: fundraising 1 ½ years
- ➤ Media & marketing strategy
- > Brian Daly stated that both projects are looking @ construction documents

Tonsler Park Basketball Court Renovations

- ➤ Doug Ehman reported that the courts are done, asphalt work done today; bases for the goals are up, needs to sit for 21 days; then backboard put up, completion date goal late June, availability July 3
- > Tree area protection in place
- ➤ Citizens very enthused
- ➤ Next walking trail end of June/middle of July
- ➤ Spray ground next phase
- Outdoor field fence removed
- ➤ June/July RFP for remainder, spray ground, field house, picnic shelter

Summer Aquatic Facility Operations

- ➤ Vic Garber reported that the spray parks opened last Saturday; open Washington & Onesty pools this Sat @ 10 am
- ➤ Summer pool passes have been on sale
- > Onesty & Washington pools will be setting up stations only for pass sales
- ➤ Webcam @ Onesty pool ability to observe lines, also located on Parks & Recreation app
- ➤ Birthday parties @ Onesty Pool very popular
- Announced that there was new staff in pool maintenance
- ➤ June 7 Sunday Sundown @ Washington Park sponsored by Parks & Recreation, Bama Works & LeRoi Moore Fund, event includes entertainment, food and swimming
- ➤ Swordfish Swim Team maximum of 225 participants practices starts next week

Board Matters

- ➤ Ned Michie asked about painting @ CHS, Doug Ehman replied will be done in next couple of weeks
- Llezelle Dugger stated that the swim team parents called and thanked for the decision for Andrea to coach this summer. Asked if there was a plan for transition; would like continuity and overlap

- Mary Wilson asked about a new advisory board member packet; Brian Daly replied that he will be asking what is a best time for board members interested in meeting
- ➤ Would like to include tour of facilities; behind the scenes tour ex. Pump room
- ➤ 6/17 next meeting Anne Hemenway suggested field tour in lieu of regular meeting
- > Byron Brown suggested an oral orientation also that is separate from field trip
- Advisory board members would meet @ Carver Center for tour
