PARKS AND RECREATION ADVISORY BOARD <u>MINUTES</u>

November 16, 2016

The Parks and Recreation Advisory Board held a regular meeting on Wednesday, October 19, 2016 at 5:30 p.m. held @ Carver Recreation Center. Members present were: Ruth Barnett, Elise Cruz, Llezelle Dugger, Anne Hemenway, David Hirschman, Jennifer Slack and Maurice Walker. Members absent: Ned Michie, John Santoski

Staff: Brian Daly, Vic Garber, Doug Ehman, Chris Gensic

Guest: Michael Barnes, President, Greenbrier Neighborhood Association, RTF member, interested in trails

Adoption of Minutes – October 19, 2016

- Changes: on page 4, under Board Matters, complete name for John Santoski
- On page 3, David Hirschman wording should be changed to <u>slower</u> family oriented

<u>Motion:</u>

David Hirschman made a motion to approve October 19, 2016 minutes with above changes, Llezelle Dugger second, motion was unanimously approved.

Ragged Mountain Process Update

- Brian Daly stated that there was a meeting on Ragged Mountain with the Planning Commission last week. Planning Commission was evenly split, was a spirited discussion, and outlined for them what was next in the process. He stated that Planning Commission member's comments are on website.
- Showed board members Ragged Mountain map with comments from Advisory Board
- > Chris Gensic discussed map with shared use proposal.
- > Ragged Mountain will be before City Council @ their December 5th meeting.
- Will add boat ramp to map
- Dogs not permitted except service pets
- > Anne Hemenway asked if received feedback from bikers?
- David Hirschman asked how nuances are going to get tracked. Brian Daly replied that there will be a draft ordinance which will state that bikers will be allowed on designated trails in a few locations, there will also be locations where bikes won't have access

Meadowcreek Valley Master Plan Implementation

- Chris Gensic discussed plan with cost estimates. What is our crew going to do, what contractor is going to do. Plan is @ 90% complete. Hope to have plan approved, so ready to build by January, 2017.
- > FEMA has approved new flood model which will be certified in register March, 2017.
- Request was sent out for costs \$111,000 cost per bridge. Get two primary bridges in first.
- Concept design on culvert improvements, 75% complete
- > Working on land acquisitions, don't have a cost estimate yet
- Disc golf has been very successful

Tonsler Park Master Plan Implementation Update

- Michael Barnes, guest, stated he had been @ the public meeting, 70 people showed, thanked staff for support. He stated the following:
 - Tunnel under railroad, very important

- Would like multi-purpose trail to stay
- Current trail plan has been tweaked, boardwalk has become longer
- Would like to see linkage beyond neighborhood, possibly to ride bikes to shopping, feels linkage is very critical
- Asked to reconsider curves, doesn't look bike friendly
- Stone dust trail should be bike able
- Property Kenwood split , built house, next to piece of land, discussion with owner, would like a report on status of that property
- Thanked for support, look forward to being regional, would like pedestrian trail built

<u>Tonsler Park</u>

- Doug Ehman stated that once contractor is ratified, should have something happen after Thanksgiving
- Splash pad & restroom building @ NDS for plan review, have sent some comments, and have begun review process, working with utilities to get some things done. Should be wrapped up by Christmas
- Splash pad plus new restroom building, modular unit coming in between splash pad & basketball courts
- > Both doors will be on the front of the building, will be easier to monitor
- Jennifer Slack asked where there was a copy of the Tonsler Park Master Plan, Chris Gensic replied that it was on the Parks & Recreation website

Comprehensive Plan 2017 Update & Park Classification Review

- David Hirschman stated that he thought the park classification system was a good document for board members to review. Classification system will provide guidance on types of uses generally allowed in parks.
- Brian Daly stated that every jurisdiction is required to update their comprehensive plan every 5 years. Included facility standards for first time.
- 2013 plan update plan was streamlined, high level list of what the neighborhood wanted to accomplish
- Next review cycle will work internally to update 2013 plan, next year 2017, will include community and Planning Commission
- There was a discussion on the different classifications what the differences was, ex. neighborhood, regional, etc.
- Community standards rises to the facility standards, guides land acquisitions, designs
- Added 5th classification water management areas ex. Ragged Mountain, Meadowcreek Valley Stream, areas intended to be preserved, intended for preservation and conservation
- > David Hirschman asked board members to read classifications

Chairman's Matters

- David Hirschman reported that he was paddling down the Rivanna River Riverview Park and saw the new ramp; Chris Gensic replied that the Rivanna Conservation Alliance thought that was a better spot, and it was built more like a pier and has been very successful. Rivanna Conservation Alliance and Rivanna River Company helped pay for lumber & provided labor to build it.
- David Hirschman stated that he would like to meet the New Urban Forester, Brian Daly replied that new staff would be @ next month's meeting which included Urban Forester & Project Manager

Maurice Walker asked about Washington Park connection to upper & lower parts, asked if there were any future plans for this area, Doug Ehman replied that staff has been spending time trying to fix it up
